Doctor- The day after tomorrow, at 8.30 am, you must go with an empty stomach.

Present simple tense (third person singular):

The present simple tense is used to express habits, true actions, and repeated actions.

Normally, in the present simple tense, an "s" is added to the end of the verb when the verb is used with singular nouns or pronouns (he, she, it).

Example:

It hurts for 5 minutes and then it comes back again.

In Ireland

When you come to Ireland, you should always register with a GP, which is short for General Practitioner. GP is the name given to a family doctor who provides services outside of the hospital. A GP's office is often called a 'surgery' or a 'practice'. Usually, you have to be referred to all other health services by a GP. However, a GP will meet most of your healthcare needs, including treating acute and chronic illnesses, preventative care, and health education. Many also provide maternity and infant care services. Anyone can access a GP, even if you do not have papers to be in Ireland. A helpful organisation for some migrants is 'Cairde' (the Irish word for 'friendship'). They work towards improving health inequality for ethnic minorities. Follow the link to visit their website:
