Gary- Oh hi, Marta! Come on in. Yes, that's me. How are you?


Marta- Fine! I really like Limerick. I'm glad to be here.

In Ireland

You may notice again in this dialogue that some words have different meanings in Ireland. For example, an apartment is often called 'a flat'. The word 'grand' is used generally as a word for 'fine' or 'OK'. There is also a tendency to call a stove a 'cooker'.

It can sometimes be difficult to find accommodation in Ireland's major cities, especially Dublin. Rents in the city centre can be very high. If you are living in Ireland as a student, most colleges and universities will have an accommodation office where you can get help finding a place to live. 
