

Characters: Jason (student) and Patricia (administrator of the study department)

Situation: In a study department

Jason

Patricia

Jason- Good morning.

Patricia- Good morning. Can I help you?

Jason- I hope so. I have just finished my studies in Potsdam and I need to get my diploma officially recognised.

Patricia- What faculty did you study at?

Jason- At the faculty of economics.

Patricia- So you can apply for the recognition of your diploma at our School of Economics.





Jason- What do I have to do?

Patricia- First, write an application for the recognition of your diploma with copies of the required documents.

Jason- And what should I write in the application?

Patricia- Your name, surname, date and place of birth, your permanent address so that the documents can be sent to you.

Jason- And shall I write the name of the city where I studied as well?

Patricia- Yes, of course. You have to write the whole name of the school, city and state where you studied. Don't forget to write the name of the field of study and the date of putting the application in as well. It is necessary to write the reason why you are applying for the recognition too.

Jason- And what documents shall I bring?

Patricia- Bring the original or an officially verified copy of your diploma, a list of your examinations, and the officially certified English translations of all the documents by a certified translator.

Jason- And how long do you think my application might take?





Patricia- It usually takes about 30 days from the date of delivery of the application.

Jason- And is there any fee?

Patricia- Yes, you must pay €100 for the recognition of your diploma.

Jason- Where shall I pay this fee?

Patricia- You can pay the fee when putting in the application in the cash office or you can send the money to this account and add the payment confirmation to the application.

Jason- And who decides on the recognition of my application?

Patricia- Applications for the recognition of diplomas are judged by the head of the department.

Jason- Could you tell me reasons why my application might be rejected?

Patricia- If the content for the subjects and the number of hours do not conform to the Irish system.

Jason- And if I do get my application recognised, will I get a document as proof?





Patricia- You'll get a certificate of recognition for your university education but you won't be able to get the same degree our students get.

Jason- And will you be able to send me the certificate to my home or shall I come in here again to pick it up?

Patricia- We will send the certificate and the documents by mail to the applicant personally.

Jason- Thank you very much. Goodbye.

Patricia- You are very welcome. Goodbye.



In Ireland



If you have a certificate, diploma or degree obtained outside of Ireland, you may need to have it officially recognised for work and learning purposes. Note that if you have a professional qualification from outside of Ireland, you must contact the relevant authority to be allowed to practise here.
